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### Scrub by Scrub: The Importance of Washing Your Produce

As we transition to spring, website, https://spendsmart. many fruits and vegetables—like asparagus and strawberries start to be in season! It is essential to remember to wash fresh produce before eating to remove any harmful bacteria like E. coli or listeria.

The next time you reach for a fruit or vegetable, use these strategies to ensure it's clean and fresh:

- Wash your produce immediately before eating. Washing some produce—like berries—before storing actually hastens spoilage.
- Wash all produce in cold water; do not use detergents or soap to clean the outside of your fruit.
- Try using a vegetable brush for fruits and vegetables that have thick skin.
- Produce with tiny nooks and crannies—like cauliflower and broccoli-should be soaked in cold, clean water for one to two minutes.
- You don't need to rewash products labeled "ready to eat" or "triple washed."

1 cup grape tomatoes, halved 1 cup cucumber (sliced and quartered)

1/4 cup onion, diced 1/4 cup crumbled feta cheese

2 teaspoons oil (canola, olive, vegetable)

1 tablespoon lemon juice 1/4 teaspoon ground black pepper **Directions:** 

- 1. Wash and cut tomatoes. cucumber, and onion. Stir together in a bowl.
- 2. Add cheese, oil, lemon juice, and ground black pepper. Stire until combined.
- 3. Store, tightly covered, in the refrigerator 3-4 hours before serving. Stir well before serving.

### Mocha Mugs

To a pottery collector, a "mocha mug" isn't meant for a coffee drink. "Mocha" is a type of decorated earthenware pottery made in England and sold in America in the early 1800s. Mocha pottery, or mocha ware, is usually utilitarian: pieces were originally used in the kitchen or during meals. It has colorful decorations painted in a slip glaze made from clay thinned with water to a liquid consistency. The decorations are usually painted over white glaze.

Traditional patterns have descriptive names, like "banded," "checked" and "marbled," or repeated "tulip," "fan," "seaweed," "dendrite" or "leaf" motifs. Others have less obvious names, like "cat's-eye," which consists of clusters of dots, and "earthworm," or thick, mottled lines in waves or loops.

This mug, which was made about 1800 and sold for \$375 at Link Auction Galleries, has earthworm and cat's-eye patterns in its center section, with a green and brown banded top border and brown banded lower border.

The name "mocha" may come from some patterns' resemblance to mocha stone, another name for moss agate, an opaque multicolor semiprecious stone. Mocha pottery may also be named for the coffee-colored glaze that appears in many designs.

New York City in 1938. It closed in 1974. The value of an autograph is determined by the importance of the signer, rarity, condition and proof of authenticity. Signatures on letters are worth more than an autograph by itself. A handwritten letter is worth more than a typed letter with a handwritten signature. The content of the letter also affects the value. The letter must be seen by an expert to authenticate it. Contact an auction house or gallery that holds sales of autographs to see what it is worth.

Socrates is reported to have said that "the unexamined life is not worth living." Being


open to the process of selfexamination of one's life is not always fun, but it's wise to do so, and ultimately proves beneficial. The coin on the ice started me thinking about this.

### Good night. Sleep tight. Don't let the pillows bite.

Part of a human being is a human sleeping.

Sleep is easy. I can do it with my eyes closed. Follow your dreams and fall asleep.

My brother could sleep standing up. I'm not that good, but I'm a competent sleeper. Most nights, I barely notice the sheets are made of razor wire, but there are those nights when I toss and turn, and turn and toss like a little kid on Christmas Eve. Or I sleep like a presidential candidate—I lie on one side, and then I lie on the other side. When this happens, I try to use some mental math to solve the Goldbach Conjecture, considered one of the most challenging mathematics problems, before realizing I have no idea what the Goldbach Conjecture is.

Do you remember the last time someone said to you, "I'm getting way too much sleep"?

It's easy to get eight hours of sleep if you have two or three days to do it. We need more of more and less of less. Wilson Mizner said, "The amount of sleep required by the average person is five minutes more." There is a vast difference between 6 and 6:05 in the morning.

We spend a third of our lives looking at the inside of our eyelids. How important is sleep? There's a reason every furniture store has a mattress sale every day and twice on Sunday.

My mother was fond of the old saying, "Good night. Sleep tight. Don't let the bedbugs bite." No hotel desk clerk has ever said that to me. What to do when sleep eludes you? There are sleep apps, but they don't sleep for you. Rip van Winkle didn't use one. Replace the corduroy pajamas with white noise, a specific type of sound that includes all the audible frequencies. Brown noise and pink noise resemble white noise, but people perceive them as deeper sounds. Researchers are uncertain how white noise improves sleep, but a theory is that it masks background noises that can disrupt sleep. Snoring isn't white noise.

Some people use sleep masks. On my first trip to Alaska, the extended daylight caused me to wear a sleep mask. I've no idea where I got it. What I do know is that I jumped out of bed and walked into a wall.

Maybe too many pillows are the answer? I stayed in a bedand-breakfast where I was given a heaping amount of pillows. I could bury myself in a pile of pillows, sleep in a pillow fort or play king on a pillow mountain and snooze at its summit.



Maury, one of Grandpa's classmates at Loras Academy had lunch at Alverno recently. (This was the name of the high school I attended during my junior and senior years) While we were reminiscing we both recalled a very "funny" incident that happened in the spring of our junior year.

First, Maury, I must explain that Loras Academy was a ROTC school at that time. (ROTC is Reserve Officers' Training Corps and your mom or dad will explain.) What happened was caused by a combination of a teaching method used by our commanding officer and our "daring high school mentality" at the time! (Maury, when you get to high school, Grandpa, cautions you to "not imitate" some of the things we did then, but thinks you might enjoy hearing about them!) This is what happened:

All of us were well schooled in obeying commands like "Forward March," "Parade Rest," "Halt," etc. but our commanding officer thought it would be good experience learning to give commands also. To teach us this he would call on anyone in the ranks to step in front of the company and practice giving commands. We were free to give any standard command. Because this was done very frequently some of us, suddenly, were "hit with a bright idea!" Every morning a bunch of us met in the academy book store before classes began. One morning, Maury, someone suggested that whoever was chosen to give commands give the command "Dismissed!" We

all thought this very funny and a great idea but at the same time were "chicken" to do it. That's when a classmate, ("Mush' McDermott) volunteered to do it (if called out by the C.O.) if we promised to obey it!! After "some deep thought and great soul searching" we all agreed!

It was about a week later, one warm day in May, when "Mush" McDermott was called from the ranks to give commands. We were all thinking will he or won't he? After giving a few routine commands Grandpa still remembers "Mush" in a loud voice giving the command "companyyy dismissed!!" The scene was confusion mingled with mass hysteria! We scattered in all directions running away in individual small groups. After a short time the reality of the moment hit us and we slowly returned to the area where we had been "DISMISSED"!

Looking back, Maury, Grandpa admired the way our C.O. reacted. He simply (but with unmistakable authority) said: "O.K., this one time you surprised me and with my authorization from now on, only I am authorized to command "Dismissed!" None of us ever gave this command again!!!

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### The Hour is Late $\dots$

In Missouri, where I now live. our weather was as upside down as it was in the tri-states: the only difference was that there was no significant snow. Nonetheless, our temperatures reached record highs in the middle of winter and beyond, and in between, they plunged to a few below-zero nights. Many wondered if the cold temperatures would kill the swelling buds on trees and shrubs. My best response is to wait and see. Down here, the Dogwoods and Forsythia are blooming and seem undamaged.

Humanity controls very little: Nature has survived far longer than human beings, changing and often reinventing itself as needed. Regarding trees or shrubs that seem to be budding out too soon, yes, they may be damaged; they may even die. Nature has a backup plan; most trees and shrubs have secondary buds that will take over if frost kills the first buds; you must wait and see.


Shrubs and perennials planted just last year may not fare well because their root systems have yet to acclimate fully to their new growing space. Such was the case for three new shrubs I planted, typically hardy in a zone colder than Missouri. The results may have differed if I protected the woody stem with mulch. I will work smarter in my garden this season and be in greater harmony with Nature as I observe how Nature adapts to the unexpected.

Yes, Nature adapts, but not at the speed humans are destroying the bed in which they sleep. Walt Kelly, a political and social cartoonist, created an anti-pollution poster for

Earth Day 1971. In the poster, the character "Pogo," looking at trash everywhere, says, "We have met the enemy, and he is us." More than fifty years later, little has changed; from the Industrial Age to the present, we have polluted everything we have touched. Climate change genuine, deadly, and unlike anything the Neanderthals may have caused—is real.

Like Nature, the wild card of climate change is unpredictable, but I do not believe it will create any long-term feelings of optimism; I think quite the opposite. So, I will leave you with this. Look at your chemical arsenal for the garden. Remove the toxic chemicals and take them to a site that properly disposes of them. Do you have a company that commercially applies weed and insect control products? Remember: toxic chemicals will kill insects, good or bad—they do not discriminate. We need to stop using toxic chemicals in our gardens and find safer ways to control weeds and insects. Natural insecticides and organic fertilizers are a good place to start.

Should you feed the lawn? Most would say yes, and when used appropriately, fertilizer will not decimate the insect world. There are other ways to control weeds, with mowing being my first advice. Cut grass up to three inches, where many weeds cannot get a foothold to grow. If "bad bugs" arise, use insecticidal soap. If you believe you must use toxic chemicals, be sure you're not using them where bees and insects pollinate. There are many safe ways to engage with Nature without causing irreparable harm. 

And children remind us that



### **Expanded PACT Act**

Expanded benefits for the PACT Act have kicked in years sooner than expected. As of recently, March 5, 2024, veterans who were exposed to toxins can get VA health care without applying for VA disability benefits first.

The PACT Act covers over 20 presumptive illnesses for exposure to Agent Orange and other toxins, as well as the burn pits, radiation, oil well fires, depleted uranium and more. The covered illnesses include emphysema, chronic bronchitis, a dozen types of cancer and interstitial lung disease.

Deployment wasn't necessary; veterans were exposed to asbestos, firefighting foam, paints, chemicals, pesticides, Camp Lejeune water and more here in the U.S.

If you filed before and were turned down, file again or call. The VA is supposed to go through the files and contact you, but don't wait on that.

If you're already enrolled in VA health care, call your local

VA health facility and ask for your initial screening for toxin exposure. Don't wait on this; get a baseline test.

To get more information, call **800-698-2411** (800-MYVA411).

Or go online to *VA.gov/PACT* and scroll through the information. You'll find links to file for VA disability, a supplemental claim and more. Read about military exposures at *www.publichealth.va.gov/exposures*.

For all the millions the VA has spent to inform veterans about PACT, there are some they're leaving out: members of the Maine National Guard who trained at the Canadian military support base in Gagetown, New Brunswick, Canada. In 1966 and 1967, the place was saturated with Agents Orange and Purple as a means of testing effectiveness in killing foliage.

In 2005, the Canadian government did site testing of the ground, water and air. They ended up handing out money to Canadians who'd been there.

Gagetown is still used for National Guard training, not only for units from Maine but other states as well. People became ill, of course, from exposure, but they're not eligible for VA health care for exposure to Agent Orange or any of the other "rainbow" of toxin colors at Gagetown.

The scammer quickly went on a spending spree. It's rare, but the criminal was actually caught. While he might get a few years in jail, the victim has been left to try to pick up the pieces of his life, with no hope of getting that money back.

Some basic hints for safety: If you're uneasy about any portion of a call, HANG UP.

Don't do banking on your phone or computer, even if you know what you're doing with those devices.

If you get a call from someone claiming to be at your bank, hang up. Dial the number of the bank yourself and find out if they were actually looking for you. Especially do not follow their instructions if the "security" people at your bank insist you need to transfer your money into a different account to keep it "safe."

If you're asked to call \*72 followed by a different number, HANG UP. Do not dial \*72. It's a call forwarding option that prisoners, callers to 900 sex line numbers and people in foreign counties use as a way to charge expensive calls to your phone.

Don't panic if you suspect you have a scammer on the line. Just hang up.

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

- If you make your own broth, you can freeze cubes in easy-tomeasure amounts by using your muffin tin. Measure out broth in half cup or cup amounts, then freeze. When done, pop them out into a freezer-safe baggie.
- Try this trick to increase the volume when listening to music

on your phone (without earbuds, that is): Place it in a deep bowl. The bowl amplifies and directs the sound.

 Chrome is easily cleaned and shined up with vinegar. Keep a misting bottle in the bathroom to give handles a quick swipe after getting ready in the morning or evening.

 Ice cream cones with a flat bottom make a great container for cupcakes. Fill cones twothirds full with batter, bake as directed, and you have cupcake cones! Frost and go!

• I sew looped tags onto the corner of our family's wash cloths. My husband installed several hooks in the shower, and when we are finished with our wash cloth, we hang it up by the tag after rinsing it out. They do not mildew this way, because they are allowed to dry.



## **Contract Bridge**

### The Case Of The **Missing Damsel**

East dealer. North-South vulnerable.



If you and your partner agree that certain bids show certain types of hands, you will naturally understand each other better in a great many situations.

But it's also true that your opponents, who are entitled to know as much about your methods as you do, can occasionally put this knowledge to deadly use against you.

Consider today's case where declarer profited greatly from information acquired during

both the bidding and play. East, playing 13-to-15-point opening notrumps, bid one notrump, after which North-South quickly arrived at four hearts.

West led a spade, and East's ten forced the ace. Declarer returned the queen of trump, taken by East with the ace. East then played the king of clubs, queen of spades and ace of clubs in that order. South ruffed, cashed the jack of trump, ruffed a spade in dummy and was then faced with the critical problem of which way to take the twoway diamond finesse.

You might think that declarer would assume that East, who opened one notrump, must have the diamond queen and would finesse accordingly. But South did not fall into this trap.

East had already shown up with the Q-J-10 of spades, ace of hearts and A-K of clubs — a total of 14 points. Declarer was thus able to deduce that East could not have the queen of diamonds for his 13-to-15-point notrump opening.

South therefore took the diamond finesse through West, and as a result made four hearts. East had unintentionally let the cat out of the bag by innocently opening with one notrump.

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### **Try This** Simple-to-Make Fruit-Juice Gelatin

When a snack attack hits or you crave a sweet dessert after a meal, what do you reach for: crunchy cookies, creamy pudding or a silky chocolate pie?

I've been thinking about how these tempting treats come in all shapes, sizes and wonderful tastes, but it's also their texture that's part of the draw. How about something smooth and also wobbly, jiggly, shimmery and just plain fun to eat? That's where this recipe for cooking up healthy, fruit-juice-based gelatin comes in.

Cooking a batch of fruitjuice gelatin is as super simple to make as the Jell-O brand you may have eaten as a kid. but in this version, you'll be heading to the juice aisle of your grocery store.

Look for clear juices (without added sugar), and while you're at it, you might want to pick a flavor that's new to your kids. My latest bottled juice picks were peach mango and cranberry pomegranate, along with my all-time favorites pure grape and white grape.

This recipe is ideal for cutting chilled gelatin into bite-sized square blocks. Serve them in small dessert dishes or parfait glasses. Top with a dollop of whipped cream for a special occasion.

Or you might like to create whimsical shapes with cookie cutters. How about shamrocks for St. Patrick's Day or alphabet letters that spell your toddler's name? Set out the healthy snacktime treats on a platter for the taking.

#### SIMPLE-TO-MAKE FRUIT-JUICE GELATIN

- 2 cups 100% fruit juice (avoid pineapple juice)
- 2 (1/4-ounce-sized) envelopes unflavored gelatin, such as the **Knox brand**

In a medium-sized saucepan, heat 1 1/2 cups of juice until it just reaches a boil. Remove from heat.

Meanwhile, pour the 1/2 cup of remaining juice in a mediumsized bowl (preferably one with a spout). Sprinkle 2 envelopes of the unflavored gelatin on top and let stand at least 1 minute. Add hot fruit juice and stir until mixture is completely dissolved.

Pour into a bread loaf pan if you're cutting them into square blocks. Or pour into an 8-by-8inch baking dish if you're making shapes with cookie cutters. Chill until firm, about 3 hours.

Dip the base of the pan or baking dish into warm water for a few seconds to loosen the gelatin. Cut into square blocks or cookie cutter shapes. I use a small offset frosting spatula for lifting the shapes out of the pan.

Cook's Note: For a lighter, less-dense gelatin, use 1 envelope (1/4 ounce) of unflavored gelatin rather than 2. Pour finished mixture directly into a serving bowl or dessert dishes to chill.

#### Grill Preparation:

Preheat the grill to medium high heat. If desired, use a cast iron pan, but you can also prepare this directly on the grill grates. Sear the pork loin on all sides, about three to four minutes per side. Continue to grill, rotating periodically, for

pork loin is about 145 degrees. Allow three minutes of rest time before slicing.

### Oven Preparation:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Heat two tbs. olive oil in a sauté or roasting pan. Sear on all sides, about three to four minutes per side. 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
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


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
