Opening lead — king of clubs.

You might wonder how declarer lost a trump trick in this deal and went down one in five hearts. But the fact is that it did happen, and it all came about in a perfectly natural way.

The hand was played in New Orleans in the 1978 World Open Pairs. North, Ahmed Hussein, partnered by Omar Sharif and representing Egypt, opened the bidding with one club.

East, Leon Tintner, partnered by Nadine Cohen and representing France, overcalled with two spades, indicating a strong six-card suit in a hand of less than opening strength.

Sharif now boldly bid three hearts despite his five high-card points and dreadful heart suit. Obviously, he could not bring himself to pass, but this action ultimately came back to haunt him.

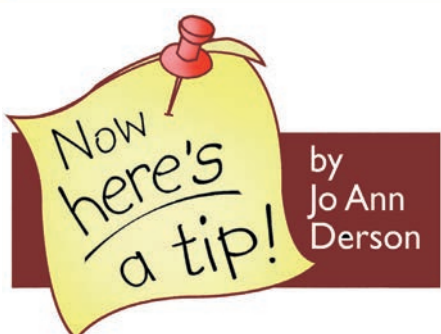
West jumped to four spades, and North, not knowing whether his side could make five hearts or whether the opponents could make four spades, decided to cater to both possibilities by bidding five hearts. That closed the bidding, and Cohen led the K-A of clubs.

Then, knowing a spade shift could serve no purpose since South had to be void in the suit, Cohen continued with a low club. This was the straw that broke the camel's back. Tintner ruffed dummy's nine of clubs with the jack of hearts, and Sharif was down one before he could even get started.

Declarer had no trouble taking the rest of the tricks. He ruffed the spade return, cashed the A-K of trump and the A-K of diamonds, then ruffed a diamond in dummy, establishing the rest of the suit. However, this was little consolation for someone who had lost a trump trick with a combined total of nine trumps headed by the A-K-Q and the trumps divided 2-2 in the opponents' hands.

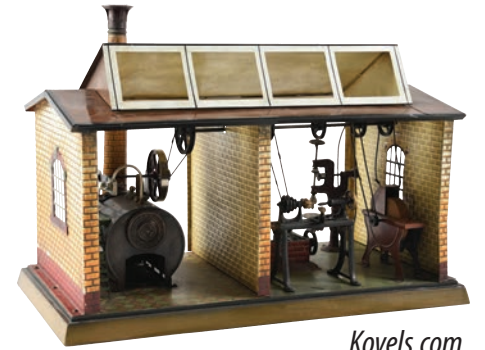

**Antique toys**

Antique toys can give us a glimpse into the time they were made. Even if they are not exact models, we can get ideas of the cars people drove, how they dressed and furnished their homes and what professions they had or pastimes they enjoyed. If antique toys teach us about the past, they taught the children who played with them about the future. Toy cars, trains, farm tools, dolls and dollhouses prepared children for their adult responsibilities.

This miniature tin factory was made by Gebruder Bing (Bing Brothers), a German company that was making metal toys by the 1880s. It became one of the largest toy manufacturers in the world and is famous for its toy vehicles (cars, trains and boats) and steam engines. This toy factory, which sold for \$4,864 at Morphy Auctions, may have been an educational model to train factory workers, a more serious purpose than that of a typical tin toy.

years. The base is very large and heavy. It has a reverse-painted umbrella shade and is from about 1910.

A: Bradley & Hubbard was founded in 1854 by Nathaniel Bradley, his brother, William, and his brother-in-law, Walter Hubbard. The company made clocks, sewing machines and other products. Kerosene lamps were made beginning in the 1860s. The company was reorganized as Bradley and Hubbard Manufacturing Co. in 1875. It became a division of the Charles Parker Co. in 1940. Production of Bradley & Hubbard lamps ceased in the early 1950s. Lamps with reverse-painted glass shades should be kept away from sunlight and heat, which can damage the colors. Don't use a lightbulb that's too hot. Reverse-painted glass should never be washed, just dusted. Use a clean, soft cloth, and don't apply too much pressure. It could scratch the glass or cause it to crack.

TIP: Put a vinyl record back in its sleeve. It will collect dust if left on the turntable.

**Trees, Glorious Trees!**

For more than 25 years I served on the Asbury Park Board and my passion for trees was immediately evident. I wrote grants to Trees Forever, an Iowa organization founded in 1989 by Sharon Ramsey, seeking financial help to provide trees for our community. With Park Board support, I successfully wrote twenty grants to bring trees to the city and residents of Asbury. Though I no longer live in Iowa, I was recently informed of a Tree Voucher Program for City of Dubuque residents developed with input from Trees Forever and supported by local Trees Forever volunteers. I strongly recommend those who qualify to take advantage of this program.

There are two qualifications required to receive a voucher. First, you must be a homeowner within the city limits of Dubuque, and second you must attend a 75 minute information session on tree care and the benefits of trees. There will be two sessions: Thursday, July 27th at 6:30 PM at Convivium, 2811 Jackson St. and Thursday, August 17th at 6:30 PM at the Salvation Army, 1099 Iowa St. Register online at <https://www.sustainabledubuque.org/tree-voucher>. The form is simple: name, address, email address, phone, and city. In addition, you can check boxes if you need help for Transportation from the nursery or for Tree Planting. You are also asked to check which session you will attend. I hope the Golden View will be out before the July 27th session!

There are \$75, \$125, and \$250 vouchers available, and distribution is based on your address which factors income and the urban heat island effect. Areas of the city covered with large amounts of pavement and

concrete create "heat islands" which absorb and retain heat more than areas of grass and soil. The voucher value is higher for residents living in heat island areas. You can redeem vouchers at Wagner's Nursery, Steve's Ace Hardware Home & Garden, and Cornerstone Nursery (4101 Pennsylvania).

Tree sizes are limited to nursery containers from #15 to #25; smaller trees such as fruit trees may be in #10 containers. Trees must be planted on your personal property, not on the city right of way or easement so be sure to check; in fact, you may want to make an Iowa One call to be sure you do not dig into any buried lines. Also, though you may find the following trees available in nurseries, they are prohibited in this program for a variety of reasons. In some cases, such as with the Blue Spruce which has fungal problems, Ornamental Pear which become invasive, Ash which host borers, ornamental Cherry and Crabapple, Norway and Freeman Maples, and any tree whose hardiness is zone 5 or greater.

Though your voucher may not cover all the cost of a tree, it will give you a good boost toward a lovely addition to your yard. If we expect to combat climate issues effectively, then know that it starts with trees. Plants are the only living organisms that replenish our oxygen supply. Healthy, mature trees each produce over 250 pounds of oxygen a year and along with grass and other green-leafed plants are instrumental in keeping humanity alive. Finally, I'm 76 and I still want to plant trees. I'll not likely live long enough to see many of these trees mature. Know this truth: we plant trees for a future yet to be born.

**Liz Lynch is back by popular demand.**

The following stories were written by Liz at age 92 as she reminisced about the early days in her life.

Picking blackberries was not one of my favorite jobs. Why? It was in hot weather, often in a thicket of bushes with a growth of grass and weeds so thick you could not see what was underfoot. Many patches in the woods were known to be dangerous because of rattlesnakes, hornets and bees.

After a hearty breakfast, we loaded a five gallon cream can, three 3-gallon buckets and a gallon molasses pail with a handle to be tied to a leather belt around our waist. Both hands were free to pick with little exertion. We wore sunbonnets or straw hats and a man's long sleeved shirt over our arms to protect us from being scratched and bitten by insects.

Martha, Agnes and I hitched old Tybe, a brown draft horse, to a single buggy, loaded the utensils and lunch with a gallon glass jug of water with a corncob for a stopper.

Tybe didn't like this berry picking trip any better than we did, as he had an unwilling disposition especially when hitched to this single buggy with a woman driving. He often turned so short in the middle of a hill that he almost upset the buggy. No tugging at the lines to keep him on the road did one bit of good — he turned around and started home.

Martha hopped over the wheel, caught his bit and turned him back on the trail. This venture might happen two or three times before we got to the berry patch.

We knew why. He was tied under a shade tree, awaiting our many returns with berries until the cream can and buckets were filled. Flies and mosquitoes, or bott bees often kept his head in steady motion to ward them off. He whinnied each time we returned. I'm sure he was saying, "Let's go home."

There was no SureJell then so we picked a few green berries in a special pail to supply the pectin needed to make this stiff, glossy jelly.

We knew it was noon by the sun being directly overhead. We tried to get home for dinner. We were tired, hot and happy to feel the breeze as Tybe galloped all the way home.

My mother had all the quart, pint and jelly glasses washed and in the copper wash boiler ready to preserve the berries. Sauce was made first with a syrup of 2 cups of water, 1 cup sugar boiled, about ten minutes "open kettle" method. Each jar was sealed with a jar ring and a Mason jar lid. How pretty the jars looked with the berries floating in this deep red juice. The berries were served in a small dish with homemade bread as a dessert after a meal or for a treat after an evening visit with neighbors.

The jelly-bag was waiting to strain the juice as it hung from a stand draining into a large dishpan. The juice was boiled about ten minutes, equal parts sugar and juice. It continued to boil until two tablespoons tried in a saucer shows signs of congealing. Jelly glasses were filled with 1/8 inch of paraffin added to seal the jelly. Jars without lids were sealed with brown heavy paper pasted with a beaten egg white. It always worked but must be put where mice could not damage it.

The summer kitchen was the scene of this canning. The ceiling was low and the old Windsor (Montgomery Ward) range fired full blast served as a very warm place to preserve such goodies.

The larder in the cellar often had more than one hundred quarts of blackberries. A tasty cobbler was often made with a generous amount of berries on cold winter days.

We never complained but awaited the next berry picking as a way to have extra treats. We had no worry of sprays that would be poisonous. Without refrigeration, we preserved foods that made our lives healthy and happy.

How great it would be to have one more day of picking blackberries, then counting the jars as we shelved them in our cellar. Calories were not counted so the one hundred pound sack of sugar was used freely.

The City Saturday market has berries, but we could hardly estimate on our computer what that buggy load of berries and the one hundred pounds of sugar would cost — it was nature's gift to us.

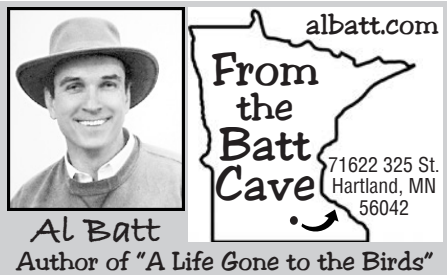

**I'm thankful dodgeball didn't involve a Challenger, Charger, Diplomat or Dart**

I woke up with a start in the middle of the night. It wasn't the cat coughing up a hairball the size of Idaho. What terrors interrupted my sleep? As a farm boy, it was usually the thought I'd forgotten to turn the water off in the barn or to close a gate and the cattle had either drowned or traveled to Abilene. This torment was the memories of dodgeball from back when the Dead Sea was still alive. I could hear the ball hitting Rodney squarely in his face. He staggered back before sliding sideways to the floor, turned into gravy by an angry ball with teeth.

Dodgeball! Many years had been stacked in uneven piles since I'd last played dodgeball.

Some schools had gym class; we had phy ed (phys ed) class because we were an advanced school academically and needed more letters. There was a rumor, which remains unsubstantiated, that several bright bulbs in my class knew that phy ed was short for physical education. They were the ones who always forgot proper clothing or shoes for phy ed. They'd heard a little exercise never hurt anyone, but they weren't about to take a chance.

We didn't know what the girls did during phy ed class, but we knew they had one. Both the boys and the girls had phy ed classes in the big gym. It was called the big gym because it was bigger than the smaller gym, which incredibly, was called the little gym. I wanted to see what the girls were doing even if they weren't doing anything, but the gym had a movable wall that slid across the floor. It was a participation dividing the gym. There was a door in the middle, but if a boy opened it a crack to take a harmless peek, the girls' teacher unleashed a severe scolding followed by realistic threats. I don't know what the girls did in phy ed. It was top secret, hush-hush stuff.

We were in the big gym with Big Jim. Jim Clark was our health\phy ed teacher. He was a wonderful guy called Mr. Clark or Coach Clark. I'm sure he had lesson plans for his phy ed class, but you know what happens to the best-laid plans of mice and men, they gang aft agley. He became a college baseball coach and when he retired from that, he was elected county commissioner. He was big on fire drills, in which I learned what steps to take if there was a fire—big ones.

Every phy ed class evolved quickly into dodgeball. We used every ball except a baseball. For that, I'm thankful. Dodgeball worked in a class of boys who had an inherent and irrational need to throw something at something else.

Dodgeball was a modern-day stoning and an early exercise in the hunger games. The five rules of dodgeball were: 1. Dodge 2. Catch C. Throw. 4. Duck E. Dodge. Defense was played by yelling, "Don't hit me!" If there had been cheerleaders there, and it's a pity there weren't, they'd have been expressing vocal energy by taunting opponents with chants like, "In your face!"

The lone survivor on the losing side was typically a skinny kid whose nerves were frayed and who'd hidden behind a bruiser known as the Chrysler Imperial of dodgeball. The Chrysler Imperial was banned from demolition derbies because it was too tough. A demolition derby is dodgeball for cars. Once the tough Chrysler Imperial of dodgeball was eliminated by a ball grazing his shoulder-length nose hair, his sole remaining teammate, who had been lying in wait in his shadow, had lost his cloak of invisibility and was slaughtered mercilessly by the other team. A King's X wasn't allowed.

I wonder if kids in Dodge City, Kansas, majored in dodgeball in college? I realize dodgeball taught me that life would throw things at me and sometimes it would hurt. I wasn't as good at dodgeball as I shoulda coulda woulda been. It had been difficult to dodge a fastball while my mind was wondering what was happening on the other side of that impenetrable wall.

There are serious side effects that can happen with tramadol, like any other opioid, and even appropriate use of opioids can lead to opioid use disorder. Misuse of prescription drugs is a huge problem in North America, and not prescribing them in the first place is a good way to prevent problems. (People who misuse opioids commonly get them from a friend or relative.)

Nonprescription ways of treating pain seem like a very good way to treat the occasional pains we all get. Topical treatments, like menthol, camphor-based creams or even topical NSAIDs like diclofenac, may not cause allergic reactions, so you might have success by trying those.

Glad to hear, Maury, how much you enjoyed the last memory. It caused Grandpa to recall another "fun" memory that, again, involved Roger Bertch plus a mutual friend. His name was Merlyn "Spike" Weber. Like Roger, he was a Classic League sponsor and an excellent bowler. He owned a very well known bar called "The King of Clubs." (Remember, Maury, how Joe's bowling ball ended up in the river! Joe bowled on this team).

Roger owned "The Merchants Lounge" and you'll recall, Maury, sponsored Grandpa's bowling team. Both were well known in Dubuque and in local bowling circles. While they were very good friends, Maury, each was ingenious at playing pranks on the other! Their many mutual friends were entertained by their "creative schemes!" When, accidentally, or in confidence, they knew what one was scheming against the other, they maintained a strict code of silence and at all times were neutral spectators!

What follows, Maury, is one example of what they did - (to each other!)

Roger Bertsch was one of the few men who wore a homburg hat. Each morning he'd hang it in a back room of his restaurant. For days Spike "set him up" razzing him, saying that "only a few men" looked good in that type of hat, just wishing he could wear one, etc. He told Roger, maybe with luck he'd "find" one on a trip to Houston. After his Houston trip, Spike went to lunch at Roger's place, wearing a homburg hat exactly like Roger's!

Claiming that he bought it in Houston, Roger didn't know it was his hat! (Spike had a cohort "take" it earlier from the back room!) Maury, I hope you enjoyed this.

Dubuque County is well represented at this weeks Iowa State boys and girls baseball and softball tournaments. Congratulations to both Wahlert teams as well as #1 rated Western Dubuque, Beckman and Cascade baseball. The Bobcat softball team is also participating out in Marshalltown. I've told people around the state, there's a reason the *Field of Dreams* movie was shot in Dubuque County. The baseball heritage with professional, semi-pro and high school has been strong for over 150 years.

Tragedy was felt throughout the Iowa football complex this week when former player Cody Ince died unexpectedly at his home in Northern Wisconsin. Ince, an offensive lineman for the Hawkeyes from 2018-2021, was just 23 years old. Ince competed in 29 games, starting 10 and was voted honorable mention All-Big Ten in 2021. Additionally, Ince was an Academic All-Conference honoree. A typical small town youngster, Ince loved football, fishing and hunting. He was engaged to be married. Cause of death has not been announced. Parents, hug your kids no matter what age they are.

Hawkeye football revs up for another season in a few weeks. Fall camp starts in early August with the first game

against Utah State scheduled for Labor Day, Saturday, September 2nd.

Iowa went out and got help in the transfer portal. Former All-Atlantic Coast Conference linebacker Nick Jackson will step in and help fill the void left by Butkus Award winner and All-American Jack Campbell. Jackson, an Atlanta native, brings an impressive resume. He led the Virginia Cavaliers in tackles for three seasons, amassing 354 stops—11th best in school history—and led the ACC with 117 knockdowns in 2021. Jackson and returnee Jay Higgins will lead that Hawkeye linebacking corps.

Freshman Kaleb Brown spent last season at Ohio State, didn't play much and decided to transfer to the school that offered him a scholarship first. Brown was a prep star at St. Rita in Chicago, was the #2 rated player in the state of Illinois, and nationally the 13th rated receiver. Brown and Charleston Southern transfer Seth Anderson are immediate pass catching upgrades for the Hawkeyes following the departure of Keegan Johnson and Arland Bruce. Brown will have four years of eligibility remaining.

*Mr. Chameleon* was "the famous and dreaded detective" who often used a disguise to track down a killer. Thus the subtitle, the man of many faces.

*Mr. Chameleon* came to CBS for Bayer Aspirin July 14, 1948. Like most Hummerts' shows, it immediately grabbed a sizable chunk of the Wednesday night audience. Karl Swenson played Chameleon; Frank Butler was Dave Arnold. The show ran until 1951 for Bayer, then moved to the CBS Sunday lineup where it was heard for one more year and was a sustaining show, meaning no sponsor.

The disguise was at all times recognizable by the audience and so were the hero's obvious soap opera tactics. But then *Mr. Chameleon* was a creation of Frank and Ann Hummert, who were responsible for many soap operas during the golden days of radio. *Mr. Chameleon* was a

famous and celebrated detective operating out of central police headquarters in his relentless pursuit of criminals. A case was "famous" the moment it was assigned to Chameleon, even if the body was still warm and the killer was still on the premises. *Mr. Chameleon* really needed no help in his crime fighting. But the Hummerts gave him detective Dave Arnold anyway. About three quarters of the way through each play, Chameleon usually disappears, returning in disguise. Often the disguises were useless, designed chiefly to throw the killer off guard by making him think that the "famous and dreaded detective" was no longer at the scene.

You might catch *Mr. Chameleon* in one of his famous disguises if you listen to the *Big Broadcast* which is heard every Sunday night from 6 to midnight on AM 1370 KDTH.

### Old Sleepy EYE?

The Old Sleepy Eye Collectors Club of America was founded in 1976 to preserve the heritage of the Old Sleepy Eye Flour Mill and collectible advertising items that were created by the mill. Where it all began, in Sleepy Eye, Minnesota. The first flour mill was built in 1883. The mill once owned 27 elevators in 2 states, a vacation home in the country and a launch on Sleepy Eye Lake.

Chief Sleepy Eye lived from 1780 to 1860 and was nick-named "sleepy eye" because of his heavily lidded eyes. His people made their home by Sleepy Eye Lake in 1857. He was Chief from about 1825 until his death in 1860. The Sleepy Eye stoneware was designed and decorated with Old Chief Sleepy Eye's likeness and used as a promotion for selling flour; the pieces of pottery were given away with 50lb. barrels of flour. The stoneware pieces were later sold, printed with advertising, to grocery stores and such. Western Stoneware of Monmouth, Il originally produced the Sleepy Eye stoneware. Monmouth Pottery later bought the Western Stoneware plant, which at one time had the largest



contract for pottery ever signed in the United States.

The vase that we sold as part of a large collection of Sleepy Eye was a rare shape and color. The vase is 8 3/4" tall and is brown in color. Decorated with images of cattails, dragonflies, and frogs, this vase is highly collectible and desired by many collectors of Sleepy Eye pottery. It sold for \$1,051.00.

### Whirl Up Tasty Smoothies for Breakfast and Snacks

Smoothie. It feels good just to say the word, doesn't it? I used to think of the concoction of naturally sweet, fresh fruit flavors with crushed ice and yogurt as a magical summer thirst quencher, but with so many healthy and sometimes surprising add-ins nowadays — from kale to beets to chia seeds — it's always nice to take out my blender and give some new combos a whirl.

While my preference is still a traditional blend of vitamin-rich fruits and berries (even when they come out of a package from the freezer), my family likes a variety of updated twists, too — including adding coconut milk to the goodness for a refreshing, light taste.

But first, here are some smoothie basics using a standard blender:

1. Start with liquids such as juice, milk, kefir, yogurt, sparkling water and crushed ice.

2. Add fresh fruit (a half or whole banana is a standard ingredient for flavor and for thickening the mixture of any smoothie) and/or vegetables. To cut prep time, your school-age kids can prepackage and freeze fruit-and-veggie combinations in small plastic bags. When it's time to make a smoothie, toss in the contents of a bag with other ingredients.

3. Whirl it all together. I pulse a few times, then blend for 15 seconds or until smooth.

Now, here's my go-to recipe that is quick to make at breakfast time or as a satisfying afternoon snack to refuel. Older school-age kids can make it themselves with attention to their tastes and health needs. Be flexible, too, and experiment with the addition of other ingredients you have on hand, such as a few chunks of pineapple, slices of kiwi or a ripe mango. You really can't go wrong.

#### FRUIT SMOOTHIE WITH COCONUT MILK

Makes about 2 1/2 cups

- 4 ice cubes, crushed
- 1 cup coconut milk
- 1/2 banana
- 1/2 cup plain, unsweetened yogurt
- 1 cup fresh or frozen berries, such as a combination of blueberries, strawberries and raspberries
- Dash of cinnamon (optional)

Place ingredients in blender, starting with liquids, and process until smooth. Pour into glasses.

**Note:** If the smoothie is too thin, add more fruit or yogurt. Too thick? Just add milk or fruit juice.

  - Then press the chop down into the oven fry, turn to get all the edges and opposite sides.
  - Place chops on plate while you prepare the remaining chops.

- Prepare a baking sheet with foil and non stick spray and place the chops on the sheet while heating the oven to 375-400 degrees, depending on how hot your oven gets.
- Then sprinkle a little bit of the oven fry on top of the chops with a pat of butter on top of each chop.
- Bake these for about 20 minutes before they were done.
- While the chops bake, prepare the honey mustard glaze by whisking together the honey, vinegar, mustard, half the parsley and paprika.
- Remove the chops from the oven, drizzle the chops with the honey mustard glaze and place the sheet pan back in the oven (that is turned off) for about 5 to 7 minutes so the glaze bakes on. Reserve the remaining glaze for dipping.

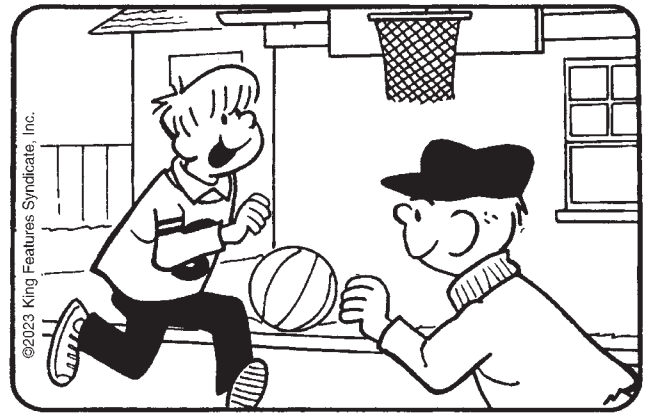

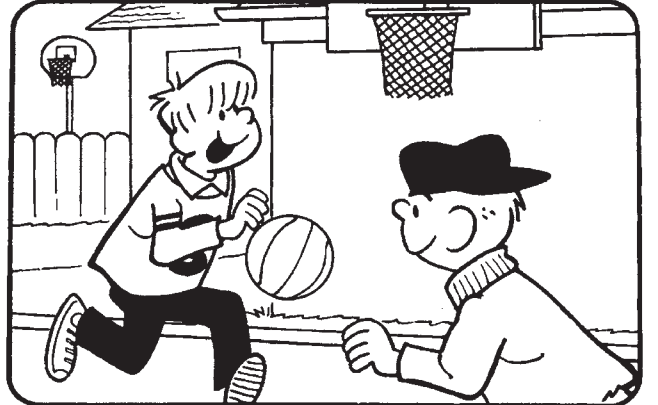

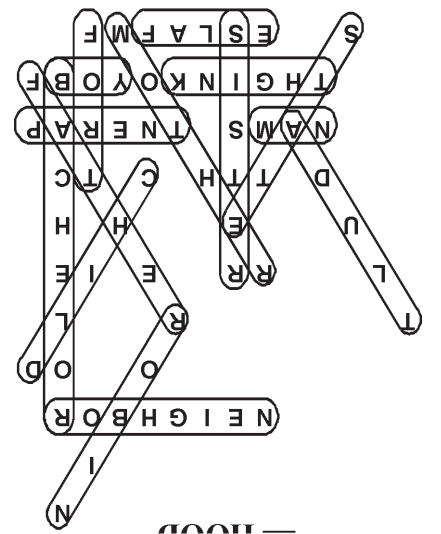
