Remembering Rudy!

The Golden View's Rudy Bellmann passes at age 88

The Golden View lost one of its founders last month. Rudy Bellmann died May 30. Rudy and his wife, Joan, started The Golden View back in July 1994.

We purchased *The Golden View* from the Bellmanns almost 9 years ago in August of 2014. I always tell people Joan sold us the paper because Rudy never wanted to sell. Part of the sale agreement was that Rudy was to stay on for the first 3 months and help show me the ropes. Well, Rudy was part of *The Golden View* pretty much up until he died. I visited with him and Joan a couple of weeks before he died. He went over some of the things he needed me to do this month that he usually took care of because he didn't think he was going to be able to do them. Joan called me the following week to let me know that Rudy was dieing and he only had a couple weeks to live. Rudy died that next Tuesday, May 30.

Rudy would stop in about every other week to check in and let me know what he was up to. That stop would often take between two and three hours. Rudy was an aquantaince before we bought the paper. I knew him before we bought *The Golden View*, through business, when I was Sales Manager at *The Dubuque Advertiser*.

Rudy also knew my Dad from "back in the day." They grew up down the street from each other and played baseball together. Rudy told some stories about my Dad and their friends growing up in Dubuque's North End. Some of those stories I heard more than once. Rudy was a talker and a walker. He had to get his steps in!

He spent many hours a week walking and talking out at The Kennedy Mall. You might know him from there. The Tri-States lost a great community member and I lost a friend.

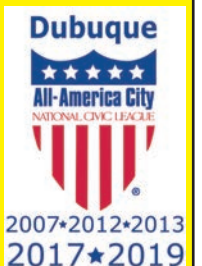

Rudolph "Rudy" A. Bellmann, 88, of Dubuque, died Tuesday, May 30, 2023.

Visitation will be from 11:00 am until 1:45 pm Thursday, June 1, 2023 at St. Joseph the Worker Catholic Church.

The Mass of Christian Burial for Rudy will be 2:00 pm Thursday, June 1, 2023, at St. Joseph the Worker Catholic Church with Father Brian Dellaert as the Celebrant. Burial will be in Mount Olivet Cemetery in Key West. Full military honors will be rendered by the American Legion Post #6 and the Iowa Army National Guard.

Rudolph was born April 15, 1935, in Rickardsville, IA, the son of Herman and Mathilda Farni Bellmann. On June 18, 1966, he married Joan Haxmeier at St. Catherine's Church in St. Catherine, IA.

He attended Sacred Heart grade school and St. Columbkille's High School. He was a U.S. Army Veteran serving from 1957 until 1960. He received his teaching degree from Loras College. Upon his retirement from teaching in 1997, he and his wife founded The Golden View Newspaper.

Rudy was very active at St. Joseph the Worker Parish. He served on the board of Mental Health America, and later on the board of Envision Mental Health.

In 1997, he was inducted into the Loras College NCBT Hall of Fame for his work on the tournament. In 2009, he was named, along with his wife, outstanding volunteer fundraiser for the Tri-State Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals. Rudy donated many gallons of blood over the years giving every three months.

Survivors include his wife, Joan; one son, Robert Bellmann of Dubuque; one grandson, Anthony "Tony" Bellmann of Dubuque; two sisters-in-law, Mary Haas and Lou Bellmann; and one brother-in-law, William "Bill" Haxmeier.

He was preceded in death by his parents, one daughter, Janet, one granddaughter, Andrea Bellmann, four sisters, Ceil Tigges, Mary Becker, Clara Ahmann, and Agnes Melssen, and four brothers, Leonard, Joseph, Carl, Gene, and Loras Bellmann.

Memorials have been established for St. Joseph the Worker Parish and the Community Foundation of Greater Dubuque for Envision Mental Health.

My Cat Follows Me Everywhere

DEAR PAW'S CORNER: I adopted a cat from a shelter just before Thanksgiving of last year. Blue is a beautiful boy who settled right into my home. He's very well socialized and doesn't even claw the furniture. However, he follows me everywhere! Even to the bathroom — I have to close the door in his face. At night, he meows and paws at my bedroom door. He runs under the bed when I leave the house, and he sulks for quite a while when I return. How can I stop his clingy ways? — *Beth in Syracuse, New York*

DEAR BETH: There's a fine line between "cuddly" and "clingy," and Blue has hopped right over it. If it helps, know that you're not alone. Studies

over the past decade show that cats bond to their humans much more strongly than we thought. Underneath that aloof exterior is a loyal heart of gold.

Cats who've had to spend time in a shelter may become overly clingy once they reach their forever home. They're finally with a forever family, and they don't want to let go! It's also tempting to give in to their demands for treats or to take over your bedroom to make up for their lost time.

Keep enforcing boundaries, but try to introduce positive stimuli before and after you shut him out of the bathroom or bedroom. Two important factors to be aware of are: 1. A daily routine and 2. Combatting boredom. Commit to spending time with your cat before leaving for work, after returning and before going to bed. Incorporate play, using toys or laser pointers that he can chase.

Don't give up. You and Blue will figure out a routine and comfort level that works for both of you.

The Goodness of God

We live in an astonishing and amazing universe! When we look up at the sky at night we see it filled with stars. But many of those sparkly objects aren't stars but entire galaxies! In fact, there are at least a hundred billion galaxies with something like a hundred billion stars each! There are black holes that can consume stars. Then there are stars that go super nova, exploding in an unimaginably huge amount of energy. Close to home, we look at the mountains, the oceans, all the diverse life around us, the life we have.

It's amazing! Even a person who thinks it all came about on its own without God doing it is amazed. But those of us who live with the conviction that this all needed God to bring it into existence see it in an even more wonderful way! After it was all created the Biblical record states that "God saw all that he had made, and it was very good." (Genesis 1:31) God Himself declared everything that was made as good. One of the psalmists reflected the idea right back to God, declaring of God, "You are good, and what you do is good." (Psalm 119:68a)

What does it mean for God to be good? Arthur W. Pink, in his classic book, *The Attributes of God*, writes, "The goodness of God is his inclination to deal well and bountifully with his creatures." It seems to me that this attribute of God being good is one we often question

more than many of His other attributes. There was the time Jesus' disciples were in a boat crossing the lake with Jesus. Jesus was asleep in the boat when a terrible storm came up. The disciples, several who were seasoned fishermen and had experienced many a storm, were scared to death. They woke Jesus up, presumably because they knew He had the power to do something about the situation. They asked Him, after awakening Him, "Teacher, don't you care if we drown?" (Mark 4:38) It doesn't seem they doubted He could do something about the storm. What they doubted was whether He cared.

I know the goodness of God is something I've questioned. When our grandson Danny died, I realized I didn't question that God had the power to heal Danny. I knew He could if He wanted to do so. I didn't even question God's wisdom in choosing to not heal him, as we all wanted Him to do. What I questioned most was God's goodness! In my heart I didn't feel as though God was being good to us! This feeling surprised me at the time, and still does. I know in my mind that God is good, but not always in my heart.

This is why it's important to regularly affirm the fact that God is good. Occasionally in a gathering of Christ-followers the speaker or leader will start a back and forth dialogue. The person up front will say, "God is good," and the people in the audience will reply, "All the time." Then the person up front will respond, "All the time," and the audience will reply, "God is good." Yes, God is good, all the time, God is good!

Life isn't always good. It's a broken and sinful world, that's for sure. Yet in the midst of all of that which is not good we can and should affirm, but God is good!

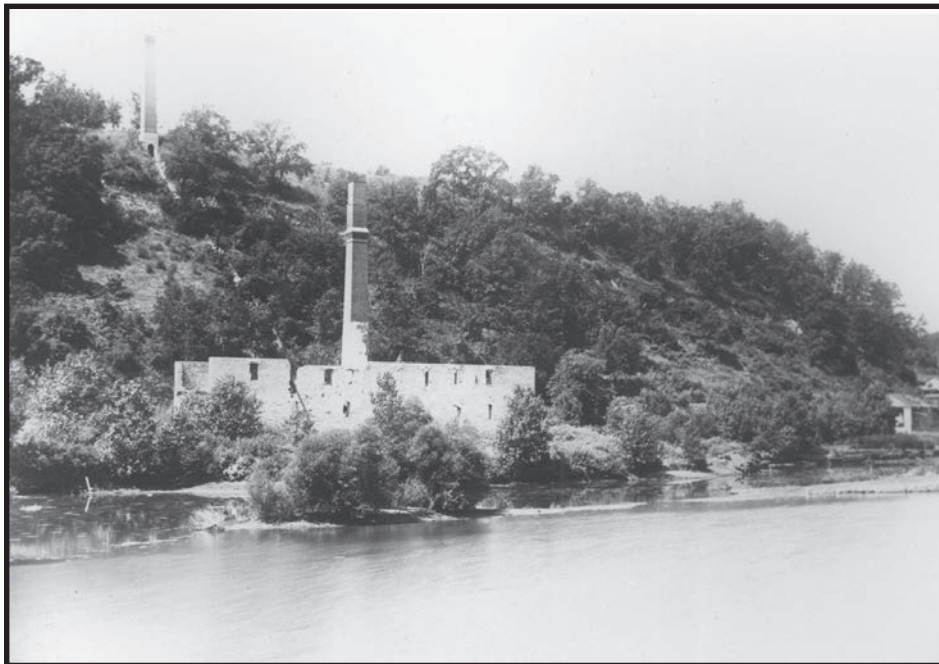

ones are as safe as possible when around fireworks.

Never allow young children to use fireworks of any kind, including sparklers. Sparklers have been known to cause third degree burns. When older children are using fireworks, make sure they are under close supervision from a responsible adult. Never let an adult handle fireworks' if they are impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.

Most of us know that water boils at 212 degrees Fahrenheit. Wood burns at 575 degrees and glass melts around 900 degrees Fahrenheit. According to the National Safety Council, sparklers can burn up to 2000 degrees Fahrenheit. We don't let our children and grandchildren put their hand inside a boiling pan of water yet every year around the 4th of July we hand them sparklers and let them run around the yard.

Thousands of people are taken to local emergency rooms due to fireworks-related injuries each year. In 2017, 8 people were killed due to fireworks-related mishaps according to the National Safety Council. Although the Dubuque Fire Department does not condone the use of fireworks for personal use, we understand that people will continue to use them. Here are some safety tips to help ensure you and your loved

Only buy and use legal fireworks from a reputable seller. When using fireworks, the people handling them should be wearing protective eyewear, long-sleeved shirts and tighter fitting clothes to help prevent clothes from catching on fire. Always use fireworks away from other people, flammable or combustible materials and houses or other structures. According to the National Fire Protection Association, there is an average of 18,500 reported fires each year due to fireworks-related incidences.

Lastly, leave the fireworks to the professionals. Grab a chair, find a good spot to watch and just enjoy the show. This will guarantee that you and your loved ones will have a safe and enjoyable holiday.

Produce Basics

Enjoying fresh produce is easy if you have the right information! **Spend Smart. Eat Smart Produce Basics**, describes how to store, clean, and prepare fresh produce.

Corn on the Cob: A summer staple that is a good source of fiber and high in B vitamins.

- Choose ears of corn that have a bright green husk.
- If husk is removed, refrigerate in tightly wrapped plastic for 1 to 2 days. If husk is still on, store uncovered in a refrigerator for 1 to 2 days.
- When ready to use, remove the outer husk and the silky strings. Break off the stalk at the base of the ear of corn. Rinse under cool running water.

Onions: This vegetable has Vitamin C and is a great source of prebiotic fibers.

- Choose onions that are dry, shiny, and firm, and do not have dents or bruises.
- Store whole onions in a cool, dark, well-ventilated place and use within 4 weeks.
- Rinse onions under cool running water before use.
- Refrigerate cut onions in a tightly sealed container and use within 7 days.

Zucchini: A rich sources of vitamins and minerals. In particular, its ample Vitamin A content supports vision and immunity.

- Choose zucchini that have shiny skins and firm flesh.
- Store in a plastic bag in the vegetable (crisper) drawer of the refrigerator and use within 4 -5 days.

Cucumbers: Low in calories but high in water

content promoting hydration and high in many types of vitamins and minerals.

- Choose cucumbers that are firm, smaller in size, and have a dark green color.

- Store in the refrigerator and use within 1 week.

Cool Cucumber Salad
Serving Size: 1 cup Serves: 2

Ingredients:

- 1 cup grape tomatoes, halved
- 1 cup cucumber, quartered and sliced
- ¼ cup onion, diced
- ¼ cup crumbled feta cheese
- 1 teaspoons oil (canola, olive, vegetable)
- 1 tablespoon lemon juice
- ¼ teaspoon ground black pepper

Tips: This recipe can be doubled or tripled to make a larger batch. Add sliced black olives. Substitute apple cider vinegar or balsamic vinegar for lemon juice.

Directions:

1. Wash and cut tomatoes, cucumber, on onion. Stir together in a bowl.
2. Add cheese, oil, lemon juice, and ground black pepper. Stir until combined.
3. Store, tightly covered, in the refrigerator for 3-4 hours before serving. Stir well before serving.

Bout of Pneumonia Leads to Shocking Breast Cancer Diagnosis

DEAR DR. ROACH: My 73-year-old wife has been diligent in getting her mammograms done, plus blood tests and doctor's visits every three months. In November 2021, she came down with what seemed like a very bad cold that was actually confirmed by X-ray to be pneumonia. After two rounds of different antibiotics, she had lost 35 pounds, and it left her with weakness and a lingering cough. A CT scan later indicated that she "either has cancer or had cancer in the past."

Multiple tests later, it was determined that there was a tumor at the 12:00 position in her breast and a tumor in her stomach that had spread to her pelvis and bones in her legs. She started taking letrozole and Ibrance, and although extreme fatigue is the most common side effect, they appear to be working.

My question is, how could this initial breast cancer have gone undetected for some time with all of the regular testing and not set off alarms? As bad as the pneumonia was, it allowed her to receive a diagnosis of a disease that eluded detection by current screening methods and very good physicians. — *Anon.*

ANSWER: I am so very sorry to hear about your wife. Breast cancer is not just one disease. We think of breast cancer as

something that can be easily cured if it is found early, but if you wait too late, it becomes difficult or impossible to cure. Some breast cancers do act that way, but others are much more indolent — they grow slowly and may never get to the point where they threaten a person's life.

Unfortunately, there are some breast cancers that can become metastatic (spreading to different sites such as the lymph nodes, bones, liver or lungs) before they are detectable at all by even the most sensitive tests, such as a mammogram or MRI. By the time they are found, because of symptoms, they are incurable by surgery and require systemic treatments like chemotherapy and hormonal therapy.

Most metastatic breast cancer is incurable, but newer treatments have improved life expectancy, with the average being three years. Screening for breast cancer is unable to save all lives. More effective treatment, in combination with regular screening, will be necessary to continue to progress against this horrible disease.

...

DEAR DR. ROACH: If a male inherits the BRCA1 gene, what should his medical concerns be? — *B.D.*

ANSWER: Men with the BRCA1 gene (mutations in this gene predispose patients to several types of cancer) are at high risk for male breast cancer and prostate cancer. They should perform a monthly breast self-examination and receive a clinical breast exam every year, starting at age 35.

Screening mammography is not recommended for men with a BRCA1 mutation. Prostate cancer screening should certainly be done, possibly starting at age 40, rather than age 55, for average-risk men. There are some medicines that reduce
